

Squiz escorted food convoys through the Gaza Strip, negotiated with the Liberation Tigers of Tamel Eelam (Tamil Tigers) and brokered deals with Somali Clansmen to ensure the safe delivery of United Nations food aid.

Squiz will be speaking about how his exposure to conflict and, for those that endure poverty, inspired him to climb Mount Everest to raise awareness of global hunger.

Squiz is the author of a memoir 'From Arafat to Everest' and has received the Order of Australia Medal (OAM) for service to the international community through humanitarian aid.
